

TDOT Environmental Supervisor



Historic Preservation Section – 1 Position

This position will be responsible for supervising staff historians within the Environmental Division Historic Preservation Section. The person must have an advanced degree in history, historic preservation, or another historic preservation related field, and must have working knowledge of the State's history and architectural history and have experience writing Section 106 documents including MOAs and Section 4(f) statements of considerable difficulty.

Archaeology Section – 1 Position

This position will be responsible for supervising staff archaeologists within the Environmental Division Archaeology Section. The person must have an advanced degree in Archaeology or Anthropology with a specialty in Archaeology or cultural resource management, and must have working knowledge of the State's prehistory and history and have experience writing Section 106 documents of considerable difficulty, including determinations of effects and MOAs.

Comprehensive Inspections Section – 2 Positions

This position will be responsible for supervising staff within the Environmental Division Comprehensive Inspections Section responsible for conducting Quality Assurance (QA) inspections on active TDOT construction projects. Position responsibilities include prioritization and assignment of TDOT QA inspection projects. This position is also responsible for conducting QA inspections as well as conducting periodic reviews of the QA inspection program process. Responsibilities will also include providing technical assistance to TDOT Operations staff regarding environmental compliance issues, assisting with the development of TDOT guidance, and participating in related training programs and committees.

Ecology Section – 2 Positions

This position will be responsible for supervising staff biologists within the Environmental Division Ecology Section. The Ecology Section is responsible for completing environmental studies required for federal and state funded transportation projects and coordinating this work with project delivery staff as needed to meet project schedules. The ideal candidate should have experience related to stream identification and wetland delineation, stream and wetland assessment, familiarity with the 401/404 permitting process, and endangered species coordination. Duties include a combination of office work and field work, possibly in adverse conditions with overnight travel occasionally required.

Highway Beautification Office – 1 Position

This position will be responsible for supervision of 2 (two) direct reports, an ASA 2 and an Account Clerk, in the Environmental Division Highway Beautification Office. This supervisory position will report directly to the Manager for Outdoor Advertising Control. The duties for this position will include management of the permitting process for Outdoor Advertising, Vegetation Control and Junkyard Control which are programs regulated by federal and state laws and the Rules and Regulations for the Control of Outdoor Advertising. This position will also be responsible for database management along with data quality control of field data collected by others.
