The Headquarters Materials and Tests Division is responsible for ensuring that all materials used in the construction and maintenance of Tennessee's highways meet the appropriate ASTM, AASHTO, and Departmental specifications. The division also monitors the quality and performance of TDOT's highway network, coordinates pavement and material research projects and maintains the department's Qualified Products list.

Responsibilities

The Headquarters Materials & Tests GTA will work in in the Nashville Geotechnical Office. Geotech GTA's responsibilities include preparing Geotechnical Reports for regional projects, evaluating and providing recommendations on construction and maintenance projects, reviewing retaining wall shop drawings for compliance and inspecting potential rockfall and landslide locations.
