Overview

TDOT is comprised of 4 regional locations, with each being responsible for traffic operations in their respective locations. Major areas of operational responsibilities in the regions are highway maintenance and repair, construction engineering, traffic and highway marking, bridge repair and inspection, state aid program and administration, materials and tests, garage and procurement, and office administration.

Other key responsibilities include management of project processes and status to ensure timely and fiscally responsible delivery of state highway transportation projects adhering to state and federal rules and regulations.

Responsibilities

Regional Traffic GTA's responsibilities include reviewing traffic control plans, preparing sign and marking layouts, and performing various traffic studies. Additionally, the GTA will assist local governments and the public with finding solutions to traffic flow problems and safety concerns. The GTA will also maintain the work order system for signing and marking, and prepare the annual pavement marking schedule for the state road system.

Qualifications

A Bachelor's or Master's degree in Civil Engineering is required. Additionally, the GTA must pass the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) Examination within eleven months of employment.

The ideal GTA candidate will have basic experience in engineering software and programs and basic knowledge of transportation engineering, and be comfortable speaking to small and large groups.
