Overview

The Tennessee Department of Transportation is currently hiring a full-time Senior Freight Planner professional for our TDOT headquarters location in Davidson County.

The Senior Freight Planner is a part of the TDOT Freight and Logistics Division. The Freight and Logistics Division provides leadership on issues of rail, water, and highway freight.

Responsibilities

Maintain knowledge base and familiarity with applicable national and state freight policies and trends in support of TDOT's programs and objectives.

Research, compile, and analyze data on freight systems and supply chains to support freight planning and policy initiatives.

Develop, prepare, and manage federal grant applications and requests for proposals (RFPs) to support other freight planning projects and initiatives.

Lead special projects for the division such as Weigh-In-Motion, Truck Parking initiatives, Freight research projects, Statewide Multimodal Freight Plan, Statewide Rail Plan, and other projects as needed.

Participate in regular collaborative planning opportunities with the private sector, metropolitan planning organizations, cities, counties, and other state agencies.

Provide research and grant administration support for TDOT's Shortline Rail Preservation Grants and Rail Connectivity Grants by responding to program inquiries from citizens and local officials, reviewing project applications, maintaining project files, and tracking program expenses and balances.

Serve as web administrator for the division.

Responsible for monitoring other programs of the Freight and Logistics Division as needed.

Qualifications

Graduation from an accredited college or university with a bachelor's degree in community planning, transportation planning, public administration, civil engineering, landscape architecture, or other related bachelor's degree and experience equivalent to three years of full-time professional planning work.

Knowledge of project and process management, problem solving, dealing with ambiguity, meeting deadlines, and customer service.

Advanced knowledge of Microsoft Excel, Word, and Arc GIS desired.
