Overview

TDOT is comprised of 4 regional locations, with each being responsible for business development in their respective locations. Major areas of operational responsibilities in the regions are highway maintenance and repair, construction engineering, traffic and highway marking, bridge repair and inspection, state aid program and administration, materials and tests, garage and procurement, and office administration.

The Regional Business Development unit works closely with TDOT Headquarters to ensure that system development and business processes meet the needs of the state as a whole and best practices are implemented.

Responsibilities

The Business Development GTA is responsible for supporting TDOT's electronic construction process throughout the region; including offering software systems tech support for field staff and consultants, assisting in system development and maintenance, and overseeing contract administration. Additionally, the GTA will assist with facilitating business training throughout the region.

Qualifications

A Bachelor's or Master's degree in Civil Engineering is required. Additionally, the GTA must pass the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) Examination within eleven months of employment.

The ideal GTA candidate will have strong analytic and problem solving skills, have a basic understanding of engineering software, and has an interest in data management.
