Overview

TDOT is comprised of 4 regional locations, with each being responsible for project design in their respective locations. Major areas of project development responsibilities are design and project delivery, technical right-of-way and utilities, survey and environmental planning.

Other key responsibilities include management of project processes and status to ensure timely and fiscally responsible delivery of state highway transportation projects adhering to state and federal rules and regulations.

Responsibilities

The Environmental Tech Team GTA's responsibilities include using design software to prepare plans with erosion prevention and sediment control emphasis, attend planning and design field reviews, and formulate storm water pollution prevention plans. Additionally, the GTA will learn to review permit assessments and modifications.

Qualifications

A Bachelor's or Master's degree in Civil Engineering is required. Additionally, the GTA must pass the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) Examination within eleven months of employment.

The ideal GTA candidate will have strong verbal and written communication skills, enjoys working in an outside environment and has experience in technical software such as Microstation and Geopak.
