Minimum Qualifications

Bachelor of Science Degree in Planning or related field from an accredited college or university and eight (8) years of planning experience including at least three years of supervisory experience.

OR

Master's Degree in Planning or related field from an accredited college or university and six (6) years of planning experience including at least three years of supervisory experience.



Assistant Director Long Range Planning

Position Description

The Long Range Planning Division Assistant Director will assist in the oversight of the Division's development and implementation of strategies that respond to the State's long-range transportation needs in the Comprehensive Planning section.

- Oversees the management of the Comprehensive Planning section which includes Research, Administration, Air Quality, Freight & Corridor Planning, and Community Transportation offices.
- Provides coordination and technical assistance in the development and maintenance of TDOT's Long Range Transportation Plan.
- Assists in the development of guidelines for coordination of land use and transportation decisions among state and local entities. This includes, but is not limited to, corridor studies and corridor management agreements.
- Establishes regular collaborative opportunities with metropolitan transportation planning organizations, rural planning organizations, cities, counties, universities, and the private sector.
- Reviews new and established federal, state, and local plans and policies and makes recommendations for implementation.

This position will require statewide travel.
