Overview

The Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) is currently hiring a full-time Environmental Manager for our headquarters Environmental Mitigation Office location in Davidson County.

The TDOT Environmental Mitigation Office is responsible for providing compensatory mitigation to offset stream and wetland impacts from transportation projects through a process referred to as compensatory mitigation. Compensatory mitigation methods include restoration or rehabilitation, establishment, enhancement, and/or preservation of wetlands, streams and other aquatic resources for the purposes of offsetting adverse stream and wetland impacts. Compensatory mitigation is required for certain TDOT transportation projects, as part of the environmental permitting process.

Responsibilities

Manage compensatory mitigation projects for two TDOT regions

Conduct or manage fieldwork

Develop compensatory mitigation plans for regulatory approval

Write or review monitoring reports in accordance with applicable state and federal regulations and guidance

Manage contracts

Supervise employees and contractors

Ensure deliverables are produced on time to meet project schedules

Qualifications

Education and Experience: Graduation from an accredited college or university with a bachelor's degree and five years of full-time professional environmental program, environmental studies or cultural resources experience including at least two years of supervisory experience.

Substitution of Education for Experience: Graduate coursework may be substituted for the required experience on a year-for-year basis, to a maximum of two years (24 semester hours is equivalent to one year). There is no substitution for the supervisory experience.

Special skills, knowledge or experience required or desired

Knowledge of federal and state water quality permitting, stream and wetland delineation experience, experience with stream and wetland compensatory mitigation projects.
