

Graduate Transportation Engineering Program (GTE) Spotlight

One of our EPIC, or Empowering People, Influencing Culture, priorities include providing our employees more opportunities to chart their career path, and our GTE Program is one example of how EPIC is doing just that! In 2022, we revamped our Graduate Transportation Associate (GTA) Program with the launch of our GTE Program. Now, entry-level civil engineers starting their careers at TDOT gain hands-on experience in the areas of Geodetics, Construction, Roadway Design, and Traffic in their first year! In year two, they advance to a Transportation Engineering Specialist 2 and can gain working level knowledge in the discipline of their choice, such as Maintenance, Materials & Tests, Structures, Aeronautics, Environment or Right-of-Way. Next month, the 2022 GTE class will continue with their discipline rotation and explore future career path opportunities with one-on-one career guidance. This month we launched our regional discipline training for the PDN, or Project Delivery Network – a scalable guide for those involved with the delivery and management of projects. The PDN was developed to provide consistency and transparency throughout the project delivery process, enabling project teams to improve reliability and efficiency. The PDN outlines the stages, activities, tasks, deliverables and (links to) references to accomplish these ends.

The PDN trainings were customized for each discipline (right-of-way, environmental, utilities, geodetics, geotech and roadway). The trainings focused on each disciplines' role associated with the four stages of the PDN (context/ scoping – stage 1, footprint established – stage 2, planin-hand – stage 3 and PS&E stage 4). During the month of September, the PDN trainings will continue for our HQ disciplines. By October 2, 2023, every project will begin following the workflows outlined in the PDN.
