### TDOT Intern

Location: Chattanooga & Cleveland, TN

Compensation: \$21.00/hourly

### Overview

The Tennessee Department of Transportation is currently hiring student interns for the Region 2 Construction offices located in Chattanooga and Cleveland, TN. The intern will be assigned to various projects that are assigned to the office. These projects will consist of resurfacing, bridge repair, bridge replacement, landscaping, and widening/reconstruction. The intern will learn to inspect projects and complete DWRs in the application. The inspections requirements will be taught to the intern by a specialist or technician currently assigned to the projects. Inspections will include, but not limited to, concrete testing, hot mix testing, EPSC, rock gradations, steel reinforcement, cut & fill slopes, etc. The intern will also participate in progress meetings, schedule reviews, pre-construction meetings, monthly contractor estimate reviews, and final records close-outs. His/her time will be split 50/50 between the field and office/meetings.

### Responsibilities

- Review project plans and specifications, discussing with the project specialist and lead field technician to understand the project.
- Gather information for generating monthly estimates and resolving any discrepancies.
- Shadow field technicians to learn about hands on testing techniques and other project inspection duties.
- Lead a progress meeting with the contractor.
- Prepare meeting notes and minutes for monthly progress meetings.

### Qualifications

- Civil Engineering, Construction Management, or Concrete Management major required.
- Graduate Student, Junior, or Senior Class Status required as of May 2025 OR recent Graduate as of Spring 2024.
- Legally authorized to work in the U.S.
- Experience in heavy civil construction and the ability to read & interpret plans preferred.
- Experience working with Microsoft programs preferred.
