Overview

The Tennessee Department of Transportation is currently hiring a student intern for the Headquarters Freight Planning Office. This intern will provide technical assistance for Tennessee's Railroad Programs including working with inventory and crash data, safety analysis, and projects. The intern will also work on numerous projects of various sizes and types to learn the basics of Engineering and Project Management at TDOT.

Responsibilities

- Shadow rail safety inspectors and state safety oversight officer as rail inspections are performed.
- Become familiar with the TDOT Railroad Crossing Safety Improvement (Section 130) Program and assist engineers in working with inventory and crash data, safety analysis, and projects.
- Enter data into appropriate programs and databases.
- Analyze data for projects and safety recommendations.
- Make site visits to project locations.
- Review project plans, contracts, and invoices.
- Evaluate and recommend improvements to the TDOT Rail Preservation grant program.

Qualifications

- Junior, or Senior Class Status required as of May 2023 OR recent Graduate as of Spring 2022.
- Engineering major (any concentration) required.
- Legally authorized to work in the U.S.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills and familiarity with Microsoft Office preferred.
- Familiarity with urban planning, logistics, supply chain, business, or public administration concepts.
