## Overview

The Tennessee Department of Transportation is currently hiring a student intern for the Alternative Delivery division, located in Knoxville, TN. The main goal of the internship focuses on TDOT Alternative Delivery methods including the development of the Request for Proposal (RFP) and selection processes. Some objectives may be dependent on project phasing, and flexibility is key. In those instances, we may adjust the deliverables. The intern will work to understand alternative project delivery methods [Design-Build (DB), Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC), and Progressive Design-Build (PDB)] and their advantages over traditional Design-Bid-Build (DBB).

## Responsibilities

- Investigate methods and best practices used by DOTs in other states.
- Review TDOT's Alternative Delivery project development process.
- Participate in collaborative Request for Proposal (RFP) development with consultants and state officials using the Project Delivery Network (PDN) as a guide.
- Design an easy-to-follow manual for using the current matrix.
- Review current selection matrix.

## Minimum Qualifications

- Civil Engineering, Construction Management, Planning, or Project Management major required.
- Junior, or Senior Class Status required as of May 2025 OR recent Graduate as of Spring 2024.
- Legally authorized to work in the U.S.
- Project Management – plan, execute, oversee, schedule, resource allocation, risk management.
- Technical Knowledge – understanding of Civil Engineering, Construction methods, infrastructure design, financial management (budgeting, cost estimation).
- Interpersonal skills and flexibility/adaptability skills preferred.
- Data Analysis skills.
