Essential Job Responsibilities

Manage resources and staff utilization and assist the Grants Team in performing their roles effectively and efficiently, optimizing the Team's ability to lead TDOT in securing and administering discretionary grants.

Lead the Grants Team in coordinating the development of letters of support for local governments' grant applications.

Manage external partners including developing and advising on contract scopes of work, negotiating contracts, reviewing consultant contract invoicing, managing contract tasks, and completing consultant grading.

Lead the Grants Team of the Community Investments Section in providing exceptional customer service to internal and external customers, exercising effective listening skills, providing prompt responses, maintaining complete and accurate documentation, and communicating effectively.

Establish and ensure there is a direct relationship between quality and work outcomes by developing and implementing quality control and quality assurance processes for the Grants Team with respect to grant application and administration activities.

Assist with managing the policy direction for the Grants Team as part of a matrix structure, creating policies, procedures, guidelines, and performance metrics that support adherence to federal and state requirements, include best practices, and improve planning processes. Assist with the financial performance of the Grants Team in alignment with TDOT financial processes to ensure transparency and accountability.
