The Community Transportation Planning Manager will research national best practices to drive innovation and efficiency within each technical unit as part of the Community Transportation Planning Section.

Essential Job Responsibilities

Manage resources and staff utilization to allow the Community Transportation Planning Section to perform their roles effectively and efficiently, optimizing the Team's ability to successfully perform liaison duties between local agencies, TDOT, and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), perform stewardship and oversight responsibilities for the federal Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Program and the Regional Planning Organization (RPO) Program, and provide technical support to local governments in developing transportation planning studies and other planning products.

Manage the policy level direction for the Community Transportation Planning Section as part of a matrix structure, creating policies, procedures, guidelines, and performance metrics that seek to develop, implement, and maintain effective local planning, funding, and reporting processes. Develop and manage the financial performance for the Community Transportation Planning Section in alignment with TDOT financial processes to ensure transparency and accountability.

Establish and ensure that there is a direct relationship between quality and work

outcomes by developing and implementing quality control and quality assurance processes for the Community Transportation Planning Section with respect to the administration and support for the development of planning programs, projects, and funding.

Manage change and conflict, clarify the vision, take ownership of the change, communicate effectively, remain transparent, lead by example, and hold yourself and others accountable throughout the process.

Manage external partners including providing leadership, guidance, and direction to the section for developing contract scopes of work, assisting in negotiating contracts, reviewing consultant invoicing, managing contract tasks, and completing consultant grading.

Lead the Community Transportation Planning Section in providing exceptional customer service to both internal and external customers by exercising effective listening skills, providing prompt responses, maintaining complete and accurate documentation, and communicating effectively.
