The Strategic Planning Specialist will oversee performance measurement for TDOT and the Strategic Planning Division. Additionally, this position will learn to lead the annual operational planning process. In this capacity, the selected individual will be responsible for working with senior leaders to develop the departmental Customer Focused Government (CFG) plan which includes identification of Key Performance Indicators, targets, benchmarks, and milestones as well as monitoring plan progress. This position will also maintain and make routine updates to the department's internal reporting documents and dashboards which provide support to senior leaders.

This position requires a collaborative spirit, a learning/improvement mindset, and the ability to influence others. The selected candidate should possess critical thinking skills and the ability to work independently, making decisions in situations that lack certainty.

- Leads performance measure data collection and documentation; uses Microsoft 365 tools and Power BI to prepare reports, dashboards, and presentations to communicate performance to internal and external audiences.

• Maintains process documents detailing specific information related to any performance measures that are publicly reported; may also maintain documentation for significant internally-reported performance measures.

Strategic and Operational Planning

- Leads the process for updating the annual operational plan; aligns the plan to support achievement of strategic objectives, works with senior leaders to pursue goals, objectives, key performance indicators, initiatives, and milestones.
- Participates in the development of the Department's strategic plan and helps to monitor implementation of strategic objectives.
- Keeps updated on performance trends within the transportation industry including monitoring performance for other state DOTs to be utilized in benchmarking activities.
- Supports process improvement by supplying data and looking for performance gaps that may be suitable candidates for improvement activities.
